PUBLIC NOTICE

In response to the spiking of cases of Corona Virus; worldwide, nationwide, state wide, in the city of Kodiak and now here in Larsen Bay, the City of Larsen Bay is Urging that all Non-Essential travel into Larsen Bay, with exception of Medical, Mail, Groceries, and essential supplies be halted. The City of Larsen Bay is also urging that all people who travel to Larsen Bay or out of Larsen Bay wear masks and gloves, to include the pilots, when loading and unloading. We are also urging no gatherings of more than 10 people, to prevent further spread of the virus.

We are advising the Lodges to follow these actions as well.

We are taking these actions to protect the population of Larsen Bay, half of which is elders and / or people with underlying health problems, who are most vulnerable to the Corona Virus.

We apologize for any inconvenience these actions may cause those affected.

This is a small sacrifice to make rather than expose or infect more of those in our community.

Please be reminded: IF YOU ARE FEELING SICK OR SUSPECT THAT YOU MAY BE INFECTED WITH THE VIRUS that causes COVID-19, you should remain at home and contact your health care provider, you should also take steps to help prevent the disease from spreading to people in your home and community.

If you are <u>not</u> sick, please continue to take precautionary measures to stay healthy:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after using the bathroom, before eating, and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- Cove you cough or sneeze with a tissue, or cough or sneeze into sick, your elbow.
- Clean frequently touched surfaces and objects daily (e.g. tables, countertops, light switches, doorknobs, and cabinet handles) using regular household detergent and water.
- Keep your circles small and social gatherings limited.
- Wear a mask / face covering when out in public.
- Maintain social distancing (keep 6 feet of distance between you and others) when out in public
